Defining patient brokering:	This is when rehab facilities hire people to recruit drug addicts or alcoholics. Recruiters are paid for every individual they recruit.		
Why is it unethical?	Facilities charge insurance corporations for tests or treatments for individuals that they do not actually offer.		This is unethical!
How does this affect those in recovery?	Individuals in recovery do not get the needed treatment. Some addicts in recovery avoid pursuing support to avoid being cheated and taken advantage of.		This is morally wrong!
How does this affect the insurance companies?	Health insurance companies may withdraw coverage for the legitimate treatment programs and addicts in recovery will not be able to afford the support needed.

PATIENT BROKERING PROHIBITED;	It is unlawful for any person, including healthcare provider or health care facility, to be involved with any of the following: Offer or pay a commission, benefit, bonus, rebate, kickback, or bribe, directly or indirectly, in cash or in kind, aid, abet, or engage in any split-fee arrangement, in any form whatsoever, to induce the referral of a patient or patronage to or from a health care provider or health care facility;	(1, a-d) 817.505	
	This section does not apply to following: Any discount, payment, waiver of payment, payment for the professional consultation, commissions, fees, payments to any health care facility, health insurer, or health group.	42 U.S.C. s. 1320a-7b(b)
